MILESTONES AND ACTION

QUARTER 1

✔ **Complete Readiness Assessment** to identify initial actions to improve coordination between education and housing providers

RMP network identifies opportunities for alignment with other local, state, and national policy coalitions and develops action where appropriate

QUARTER 2

Complete Initial Policy Impact Assessment. Findings from this assessment will help better understand how housing and education policy is impacting youth and families in this region *(with support from [Kids Impact](#))*

The RMP network and community members collectively advocate for policy that impacts access and availability of affordable housing and addresses barriers to improved education and workforce outcomes for those in affordable housing during the 2022 Colorado Legislative Session

[Adams 12 Five Star Schools](#) (Adams 12) students and their families who live in [Maiker Housing Partners](#) (Maiker) properties share what services would be most helpful to be offered at or around their homes and how those services can most effectively be delivered

Adams 12 and Maiker partners, along with students and families, set short Term targets are set to measure the increase in services being co-located and the impact they are having for Adams 12/Maiker families

Adams 12 and Maiker partners begin collective work alongside students and parents towards improving co-location of services

QUARTER 3

Develop Public Funding Fiscal Map to understand where public dollars are currently going, which public services are being offered, and where gaps exist related to affordable housing and education *(with support from the [Children's Funding Project](#))*

RMP network develops a Youth Informed 2023 policy agenda that identifies policy priorities related to housing and education

RMP network tracks the impact of bills passed during the 2022 State Legislative Session that impact this effort and lifts opportunities for improvement to legislators *(bills tracked on RMP Scorecard)*

RMP network begins working with state legislators to draft legislation to impact this effort if appropriate

Navigation/case management providers (including housing and education providers) build upon efforts already underway to improve their coordination in delivering services to youth and families

QUARTER 4

RMP network develops and adopts a strategic financing plan to implement comprehensive and sustainable public funding strategies to fill gaps *(with support from the [Children's Funding Project](#))*

RMP network drafts and files State legislation in advance of the 2023 Legislative Session (if applicable)

Third school district joins the effort

Complete additional Policy Impact Assessments specific to proposed legislation as needed

RMP network and local elected bodies work together using the strategic financing plan to develop policy and align public funding to reduce housing barriers

- Shared strategies underway between 3 school districts and housing providers to address opportunities identified through a Readiness Assessment
- Reduce regulatory barriers that limit the market's ability to build small, lower-cost homes on expensive land at the local government level
