<p><b>RMP Team identifies opportunities for alignment</b> with programs, policies, funding, and stakeholders already doing work to address the opioid crisis at the local, state, and national levels</p> <p><b>RMP Team launches the Regional Opioid Crisis Dashboard</b> that illustrates the current state of the opioid crisis based on available data, including what is most impacting target populations</p>	<p><b>Initial Voting Members of the Regional Council confirmed</b></p> <p><b>Initial voting members of Regional Council convene to confirm structure and governance, and determine who else is needed at the table</b> (<i>Both voting members and Advisory Committee members, which include community members with lived experience</i>)</p> <p><b>Attorney General's (AG) office sends dollar amounts to local governments</b> and asks them to either claim their portion of settlement dollars or allocate them to the regional share</p> <p><b>The RMP network collectively advocates for policy</b> that impacts the opioid crisis during the 2022 Colorado Legislative Session</p> <p><b>The Larger Regional Council convenes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Identifies quick wins to start addressing the opioid epidemic</b></li> <li>• <b>Establishes a data baseline</b> that provides a clear picture of the opioid crisis in the region and who's most impacted</li> <li>• <b>Sets measurable long and short term target(s)</b> for addressing the opioid crisis in the region based on which populations are most impacted</li> <li>• <b>Identifies specific areas of work to be funded</b> in alignment with the Potential Opioid Abatement Approved Purposes (<i>Two Year Plan required by the AG's Office</i>)</li> </ul> <p><b>RMP network tracks the impact of 2022 State Legislative Session bills</b> that are directly tied to addressing the opioid crisis and lifts improvements needed to legislators</p>	<p><b>July 15: Payments from drug companies</b> made to national distributor (<i>not available to regional councils</i>)</p> <p><b>Regional Council deploys funds</b> to address quick wins</p> <p><b>Regional Council accepts LOIs for first round of funding</b></p> <p><b>RMP Team works with entities who have submitted LOIs to scope and highlight opportunities for collaboration and strategize joint applications</b> (<i>in order to avoid siloed work</i>)</p> <p><b>RMP network identifies policy priorities</b> related to addressing the opioid crisis to include in the 2023 RMP Policy Agenda</p> <p><b>RMP network begins working with state legislators to draft legislation</b> to impact this effort (<i>if appropriate</i>)</p> <p><b>First Year allocations sent to the Regional Council fiscal agents</b> (<i>Projected to be in September</i>)</p>	<p><b>Regional Council accepts proposals for first round of funding</b></p> <p><b>Regional Council evaluates proposals and determines first round of awards to entities who will engage in work that will most impact the opioid crisis</b></p> <p><b>RMP network drafts and files State legislation in advance of the 2023 Legislative Session</b> (<i>if applicable</i>)</p>	<p><b>Regional Council tracks regional progress and impact of fundees' strategies on shared goals</b> via the Data Dashboard</p> <p><b>Ongoing improvement and refinement of action is underway</b> (<i>both by the regional council around funding disbursement, and fundees around their strategies</i>)</p>
