### How are community members compensated for their time?

Compensating community members for their time to sit along individuals with formal authority to co-develop solutions is critical. Partners who represent organizations, and the RMP team, are paid to engage in this work by representing their organizations. Likewise, community members also need to be compensated for their time and involvement. Compensation may be as simple as a financial incentive, but it also could look like mitigating unique challenges and barriers specific community members face in being able to engage in this strategy (for example transportation, technology assistance, child care, etc.).
