

SEPT. 27TH LOGIC MODEL SUB-COMMITTEE MEETING 2 RECAP



Key Decisions Made

- ☑ A reduction in opioid overdose deaths will be recommended as a target for this effort
- ☑ Quantifiable metrics around what it means for a community member to thrive in the wake of an OUD still need to be identified
- ☑ The logic model is not needed in order for this group to make a recommendation to the Regional Council on draft allocations for the first year of funding



Meeting Synthesis

- The group picked up where they left off and continued populating the logic model with expected outcomes for some of the strategies lifted in the previous meeting
- The validity of different strategies was discussed as there was a range of perspectives on the need for certain approaches like reducing the prescribing of opioids all-together
- Community level outcomes were discussed in the context of ensuring this effort is having an impact. The group decided that ultimately people should be surviving and thriving but that they have to survive before they can thrive. Given this fact, they identified a reduction in opioid related deaths as a target and acknowledged the need for more discussion around what it means to "thrive" moving forward



Next Steps

- RMP team will put together a strong recommendation for allocations based on input from these sub-committee meetings, asset inventories, stakeholder/survey feedback, and supplemental readings on the use of funds to bring to the next meeting for approval
- Callie will continue to populate the logic model with any other outcomes that were not discussed during this time
